The Second Coming of Christ has arrived on Earth with detailed information not easily understood by people. With the sudden arrival of COVID-19 we have been asking

questions within our hearts. We must admit our lives are very busy with day to day situations that claim our total time and attention. But still questions remain; the weather is surely a sign that the Second Coming is here and very real before the eyes of the entire world. How do we address the conditions placed on earth today and how do we communicate with God? With logic we know that everything happens for a reason. First COVID-19 engulfed the Earth and then the weather is oddly personally destructive. We know for sure that God is behind both phenomenon's we no longer have doubts. With full reasoning power we know in our hearts that this is the way to deal with the earth and people busy. A sort of wakeup call, an intervention that fits the lives of all people at the same time. This is how we expect God's power to embrace the Earth and how the End of the world would look like.

Before the world began an experiment was founded, how successful can people live independently from God? All details were put into place and the experiment was initiated. Since the outcome may not be favorable the time limit of the experiment is best left in God's knowledge alone, Matthew 24:36. At the end of the experiment or rather the End of the World the results gathered from the experiment will be announced to the general public: What is God's Kingdom, What is the Great Tribulation, How can you reconcile with God. (1- God's Kingdom is the governmental force used that people naturally sought independence from, Acts 17:27-28. Religiously speaking the government is led by a Messiah/Christ, Isaiah 9:6-7.

For a Millennium the Kingdom will usher in a worldwide prosperity that provides salvation which will create a new way of governing the Earth; Revelation 11:15, Daniel 2:44.

God's Kingdom will use certain steps that will announce to the world its reign has begun call the End of the World. What passage in the Bible tells us what to expect at the Kingdom's beginning? At *Matthew 19:28 (Easy-to-Read Version)* ²⁸ *Jesus said to them, "When the time of the new world comes, the Son of Man will sit on his great and glorious throne. The information in this passage clearly says that the Kingdom will simply usher in a new world, and everything that happens causes this to materialize, Isaiah 65:17-19. What additional information does the Bible record for us? At Luke 17:20 (Tree of Life Version)* ²⁰ *Now when Yeshua was asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, He answered them and said, "The kingdom of God does not come with signs to be seen. The most important thing to realize about the kingdom is that it is not human nor is it acknowledged with human comprehension. In the Holy Bible it was always known that Jesus Christ informed his followers of the Second Coming of Christ; Matthew 24:3-14, 21-22, 29-30. So building the new world or the new heaven and new earth is the prime concern of the kingdom.*

Since it is understood what the objections of the kingdom are what important warnings are given to spiritual minded people? At *1 Corinthians 6:9-10 (Names of God Bible)* ⁹ *don't you know that wicked people won't inherit the kingdom of God? Stop deceiving yourselves! People who continue to commit sexual sins, who worship false gods, those who commit adultery, homosexuals,* ¹⁰ *or thieves, those who are greedy or drunk, who use abusive language, or who rob people will not inherit the kingdom of God. " That's what some of you were! But you have*

been washed and made holy, and you have received God's approval in the name of the Lord Yeshiva Christ and in the Spirit of our God. This warning is very important because God speaks directly to people and we need to understand when the Kingdom finally arrives and no one can tell it. With full trust we know that we cannot fool God, certain actions of people have never been accepted. The passage expresses that God's Kingdom is inherited and gives a list of action that are unaccepted. In our relationship with God we were already following the commands outlined in the Bible so we know by studying and believing in the future that the Kingdom will never accept certain conditions. Before the arrival of God's Kingdom how were devout Christians trained? At *Ephesians 5:3-5 (Names of God Bible)*³ *don't let sexual sin, perversion of any kind, or greed even be mentioned among you. This is not appropriate behavior for God's holy people.*⁴ *It's not right that dirty stories, foolish talk or obscene jokes should be mentioned among you either. Instead, give thanks to God.*⁵ *You know very well that no person who is involved in sexual sin, perversion, or greed (which means worshipping wealth) can have any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.* This teaching from the Bible leads us into finally receiving salvations and there is no confusion of the message it relays to all that read it. There is no excuse in not obeying it because it says "*This is not appropriate behavior for God's holy people.*" So in our understanding of divine requirements we have rejected truth. What passage in the Bible explains this to us? At *Titus 1:16 (Living Bible)*¹⁶ *Such persons claim they know God, but from seeing the way they act, one knows they don't. They are rotten and disobedient, worthless so far as doing anything good is concerned.* As the world deteriorates Christians have been trained not to behave inappropriately. Any person that does not follow the wise Biblical warnings will be fooled when the Kingdom arrives.

What information does the Bible have for those who have been fooled? At *Revelation 22:15 (Easy-to-Read Version)* ¹⁵ *Outside the city are all those who live like dogs—those who do evil magic, those who sin sexually, those who murder, those who worship idols, and those who love to lie and pretend to be good.*

Since the End of the World has arrived God found it necessary to publish the results gathered from the experiment since the founding of the world. The best way to express to people that human nature that has developed over time within the experiment did not work out God's will was to give a warning before the experiment ended. What passage in the Bible clearly expresses this?

At *1 Peter 4:1-6 (Living Bible)* ⁴ *Since Christ suffered and underwent pain, you must have the same attitude he did; you must be ready to suffer, too. For remember, when your body suffers, sin loses its power, ² and you won't be spending the rest of your life chasing after evil desires but will be anxious to do the will of God. ³ You have had enough in the past of the evil things the godless enjoy—sex sin, lust, getting drunk, wild parties, drinking bouts, and the worship of idols, and other terrible sins. ⁴ Of course, your former friends will be very surprised when you don't eagerly join them anymore in the wicked things they do, and they will laugh at you in contempt and scorn. ⁵ But just remember that they must face the Judge of all, living and dead; they will be punished for the way they have lived. ⁶ That is why the Good News was preached even to those who were dead—killed by the flood—so that although their bodies were punished with death, they could still live in their spirits as God lives.*

In this passage human nature or the way that people have lived throughout centuries no matter what age, reflect divine opposition. In warning the passage concludes that the pleasures of the people are called sins and death is punishment by God for doing them. So in creating a new heaven and new Earth the next step in God's plan for the

End of the World is the Great Tribulation, Matthew 24:17-22.

So what is (2- The Great Tribulation, it is a test that is given to the entire world to show that people do not do things the way God wanted them to be like, Revelation 3:10. Decisions, actions, communication, every aspect of human life are alienated from God. What passage in the Bible easily shows this? At *Ephesians 4:17-19 (Living Bible)* ¹⁷⁻¹⁸ *Let me say this, then, speaking for the Lord: Live no longer as the unsaved do, for they are blinded and confused. Their closed hearts are full of darkness; they are far away from the life of God because they have shut their minds against him, and they cannot understand his ways.* ¹⁹ *They don't care anymore about right and wrong and have given themselves over to impure ways. They stop at nothing, being driven by their evil minds and reckless lusts.* The information of this passage says that people minds were closed and they did not understand God or his ways. When people recognize that their ways moved oddly they no longer cared. The Bible does not give any more information on the Great Tribulation but since the time has arrived we can see terrible weather. The Second coming of Christ has long been heralded as an important event that we are in expectation of. Since the time has arrived how can we navigate our responsibility towards Christianity? At *2 Corinthians 13:5 (Easy-to-Read Version)* ⁵ *Look closely at yourselves. Test yourselves to see if you are living in the faith. Don't you realize that Christ Jesus is in you? Of course, if you fail the test, he is not in you.* What additional information does the Bible provide? At *1 Corinthians 11:28 (Easy-to-Read Version)* ²⁸ *Before you eat the bread and drink the cup, you should examine your own attitude.* What does the Bible explain to us to be the proper Christian approach towards faith, relationship, and worship

of God on Earth? At *Galatians 6:4 (Names of God Bible)* ⁴ *Each of you must examine your own actions. Then you can be proud of your own accomplishments without comparing yourself to others.*

During the Second Coming of Christ what should be our expectation of acknowledging our worship to God over the years? How can we prove that we have always strived towards following Christian principles? How we show God that in spite of the world's moral deterioration we have stood firm in our beliefs? In standing before the judgment seat of Almighty God have the rules somehow changed? During this power confrontation with God, what advice did the Bible have for us? At *1 Timothy 4:7 (Living Bible)* ⁷ *Don't waste time arguing over foolish ideas and silly myths and legends. Spend your time and energy in the exercise of keeping spiritually fit.* The Bible tells us that history may and can be inaccurate or just stories passed down without any real foundation to it. Some stories are handed down by oral tradition meaning they are not written down properly and saved. They may be simply stories connected to a certain country that relay culture and habits of famous citizens. Another fact may be written history that are erroneous, lies, and larger-than-life themes. We should realize that this is also human nature as well as everything else. What additional information does the Bible provide? At *1 Timothy 4:16 (Living Bible)* ¹⁶ *Keep a close watch on all you do and think. Stay true to what is right and God will bless you and use you to help others.*

In spite of the threat of COVID-19 and extreme weather conditions in every place on the globe, what does God really think about our heart conditions if we have tired as best we can? At *Philippians 2:12 (Names of God Bible)* ¹² *My dear friends, you have always obeyed, not only when I was with you but even more now that I'm absent. In the same way continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling. We can expect that God has loved those that have tired and that he know what our best is. When the time comes for the world to truly see God and acknowledge his judgment of the earth, those loyal to truth should not be afraid. (3- How can you reconcile with God, or that is how can you be sure? At 2 Corinthians 5:16-17 (Living Bible)* ¹⁶ *So stop evaluating Christians by what the world thinks about them or by what they seem to be like on the outside. Once I mistakenly thought of Christ that way, merely as a human being like myself. How differently I feel now!* ¹⁷ *When someone becomes a Christian, he becomes a brand new person inside. He is not the same anymore. A new life has begun!* This passage assures us that we cannot trust or allow the world's thinking to influence us in anyway. Because we have learned that their alienation from God makes them totally unreliable sources. If we recognize anyone, especially those who are close to us that may have changed for some reason; we must regard them as unreliable source, Matthew 24:9-13. But seeing these things do not mean we should feel conquered, no we should know that each one carries their own responsibility. Once we start our journey towards building a Christian lifestyle, we will start to physically change our

way of thinking. We believe this because this is what the Bible tells us especially in this passage. What additional information does the Bible express to us? At *2 Corinthians 5:10 (Living Bible)* ¹⁰ *For we must all stand before Christ to be judged and have our lives laid bare—before him. Each of us will receive whatever he deserves for the good or bad things he has done in his earthly body. Amen.*
